2. Presentation: Ann Olin Lifespan on the Geriatric Addiction Program

Powerpoint presentation shared which will be posted on GVHP website. Recently expanded into Livingston County. 99% in home visits, occasionally via telephone when necessary. No OASIS oversight. CASA Trinity mentioned they had fact cards on alcohol and prescription drug interactions and these will be shared with partnership.

Suicide Prevention Taskforce

Lynne Mignemi, Chairperson of the Suicide Prevention Taskforce, reported on the group's activities.

- SUNY Geneseo Out of the Darkness Walk April 15th at the college green. Sisters Making a Change is the campus partner for this event.
- Lock and Talk Livingston Lock and Talk continues to spread across the state. virtual meeting with the VA Medical Center on Long Island. They are interested in bringing this program to their area. Psych Armor; she may do virtual Save training for them.
- **Community Engagement** Presentation at DSS in March, two focus groups with older adults through the Office of the Aging, there will be two focus groups held with older adults; one in Dansville in May and one via Home delivered meals in June. There will also be communication with adolescence and young adults at the Dansville youth group in April. Via a Triad meeting Lynne and Joan shared information about suicide prevention and our Task Force. Triad meets monthly. This group has representatives from each of the 17 communities in our county as well as from the Sherriff's Office and the State Troopers. Lynne also spoke at the Office of the Aging Advisory Council Meeting in April. Groveland Fire Department events. Continuum of Care coalition presentation next week. Wadsworth Library open house next week, Safety before Summer in Wayland on Jun 14, 2023, Avon Sr Nutrition.
- Suicide risk assessment tool for youth involved in the juvenile justice program working with Columbia University
- 2-1-1 Lifeline 2022 Data continues to be shared with the task force
- Coroner's Data There are no confirmed suicides as of March 28 for this year.



Trauma-Informed Care

Rachel Pena, Chairperson of the Trauma-Informed Communities Committee, reported on the group's activities.

- Committee distributed pinwheels and yard signs promoting child abuse awareness across the county
- Continuing with Solution Focused follow up sessions with our trainers- 1 session held in February and 1 on May 15th
- Working with the Center for Healing and Justice through Sport to do a survey of coaches around trauma/ACEs/youth development and will then organize a training for youth sports coaches based on responses
- Several members attended the NEAR (Neurobiology Epigenetics, ACES and Resilience) training of trainers in March and will be developing plan for facilitating the training across the county with community members and organizations

Be Well in Livingston

Lisa Kenney, Chairperson of the Be Well in Livingston Committee, reported on the group's activities.

- Solar, BCBS and Youth Bureau micro-grant grant applications submitted for community gardens for Mt Morris and Nunda
- Be Well in Livingston (Mt Morris) Spring into Wellness Physical Activity
- Be Well in Livingston (Nunda)-Implementing CATCH in KCS; Fruit and Veg Rx session with 7 registered; continuing Euchre event; Working on grants for new sidewalks and trailhead work; 25 committee members on BWIN advisory team, 549 Facebook members; CRASE/ Situational Awareness Training: 39 attendees; CPR Class: 8 attendees; Earth Day Clean Up; School Wellness Day 5/11

Cancer Services Program. Mexican Consulate coming to Geneseo on Sept 6, 7 and 8, St. Michaels Episcapal church. They help migrant workers with service providers are welcome while Contact the Cornell Farm worker group.

Arc Glow: Membership drive going on. Go to Arcglow.org website and for \$1 become a member which helps give the organization leverage for funding.

CASA Trinity - have the youth survey reports (risk and protective factors)which they will share. There will be an online public facing dashboard from 2022. You can look at different data indicators. Youth Mental Health First Aid being offered this summer, also the NEAR training.
